Social survey questionnaire



This document provides a user-friendly version of the social survey questionnaire used in the 2010 SHCS.

Minor revisions to the questionnaire were made from the one used in 2009.

- Questions added are highlighted in **green**. (Data for these questions will be present in the 2010 data but not earlier datasets).
- Questions deleted are highlighted in **grey**. (Data for these questions will not be present in the 2010).
- Amended questions, and amended routing, are highlighted in **yellow**. (Data from these questions will be present in the 2010 data but may not be directly comparable).
