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1 Survey overview

Background to the SHS

The Scottish Household Survey (SHS) is a continuous, large-scale social survey of the composition and characteristics of Scottish households, the attitudes and behaviour of adults, and to a lesser extent, of children within these households. It was first commissioned by the Scottish Executive in 1998 and has been collecting data and reporting since February 1999.

The specific aims of the survey are as follows:

- to provide household and individual information previously unavailable in Scotland, particularly to support the work of the Scottish Government's transport, communities and local government policy areas and the work of the Scottish Parliament
- to permit disaggregation of such information both geographically and in terms of population sub-groups (such as families with children or the elderly)
- to allow the relationships between social variables within households to be examined, supporting cross-departmental and inter-departmental policies such as those on social justice
- to allow early detection of national trends
- to allow detailed follow-up surveys of sub-samples from the main survey sample, if required.

The survey is funded by the Scottish Government and carried by a consortium of research organisations involving Ipsos MORI and TNS BMRB.

This document provides details of the questionnaire used for the survey in 2011 as well as noting changes since 2006 and changes made in January 2011.

Survey design and sampling

This section gives a brief overview of the survey design and sampling. A more detailed account of the technical aspects of the survey, as well as details of response rates and data quality can be found in the accompanying Technical Report.

As part of the tendering process for the survey in 2006, tenderers were invited to propose a sampling strategy that maximised the cost-effectiveness of the survey sampling ie achieved the level of precision required from the survey at the lowest cost. Like the sampling strategies used between 1999 and 2006, the current sample design uses a multi-stage stratified design with a mix of clustered and unclustered sampling. The main features of the current design are:

- first stage, disproportionate stratification by local authority
- within each local authority, second stage stratification by the Scottish Government's six-fold urban rural classification – large urban and other urban areas combined into an 'urban' stratum and all other areas combined into a 'rural' stratum
- unclustered sampling is used in the 'urban' strata, with addresses sorted by SIMD and selected systematically from a random starting point

- clustered sampling is used in the ‘rural’ strata, with datazones used as primary sampling units (PSUs), which are selected with probability proportionate to size and, within each, a systematic sample selected from a random starting point.

There are some variations to this overall design.

- In local authorities with 80% or more of the household population in ‘urban’ areas, the sample is wholly unclustered
- In local authorities with 80% or more of the household population in ‘rural’ areas, the sample is wholly clustered
- The local authorities of Western Isles, Orkney and Shetland have wholly unclustered samples even though the urban rural classification suggests they should be wholly clustered. The reason for this is that the sample size in these areas means that between 1 in 6 and 1 in 8 households should be sampled. Clustered samples in these areas would be no more efficient than an unclustered sample but would require larger samples for the same level of precision.

1.1.1 Streaming and sub-sampling

Because of the high level of demand for space in the Scottish Household Survey, a number of sections of the questionnaire were intended to be asked random sub-samples of the full SHS sample. This is achieved by randomly assigning addresses to one of ten sub-samples, which we refer to as ‘streams’ within the interview. Two streams (1 and 6) were historically reserved for the Culture and Sport module from 2007/2008.¹ The remaining eight are used for the ‘main’ SHS script. Streaming allows questions to be assigned to as little as one-eighth of the main sample.

1.1.2 Allocation of addresses over time and between fieldwork organisations

To accommodate the requirement to provide data that is representative nationally in each quarter, for the largest local authorities each year and for all local authorities after two years, the sample is allocated to fieldwork years and months in different ways to maximize the cost-effectiveness of the design.

The allocation of batches to months within each year follows a pattern established in previous years. As the fieldwork for the survey runs throughout the calendar year, it is important to ensure an even distribution of fieldwork assignments by geographic area and other indicators such as SIMD and the urban/rural classification. There are two main reasons for this: an uneven distribution would jeopardise the requirement for the sample to be representative of the national population on a

quarterly basis and some of the variables measured by the survey are likely to exhibit seasonal patterns – e.g. rates of economic activity, modes of transport.

The procedure for allocating PSUs to months of the year is derived from that developed by the Office for National Statistics (ONS) in managing the Family Expenditure Survey (FES)² and differs only in the need for the SHS sample to be spread evenly across 24 rather than 12 months.

Each year’s allocation of interviewer assignments is listed by local authority and then by deprivation score, within local authority. Within each year, the listing of assignments is then labelled with a permutation of the numbers 1 to 12 representing the twelve months covered by the fieldwork. This permutation is generated with certain properties to avoid ‘bunching’ of interviews within particular quarters:

- the first four months are from different quarters
- every subsequent month is from the same quarter as the one four places before.

The example given by ONS (and used to allocate the 1996 FES) is as follows:

Batches of addresses are randomly assigned to each organisation in proportion to their fieldwork commitment.

1.1.3 Allocation of addresses to sub-samples

The survey is designed with the facility to ask certain questions of a random sub-sample of respondents. Sampled addresses have been randomly assigned to one of 10 survey streams and the routing in the questionnaire determines with streams are asked each question or block of questions.

Two streams – 1 and 6 are reserved for the survey’s Culture and Sport module and the remaining eight are used with the main questionnaire to split the sample, where appropriate, into random sub-

samples. Unless otherwise stated in the notes to a question, questions are asked of all streams but where sub-sampling has been used this is indicated in the notes to the question.

Data collection

The data for the survey is collected using computer-assisted personal interviewing (CAPI) either using handheld tablet PCs or traditional laptops. Two CAPI systems are used: Ipsos MORI use the Quancept system and TNS BMRB use the In2itive system – the latter of which had been used by both companies on the SHS since the survey first started in 1999 (Ipsos MORI changed to Quancept during 2009).

2 Questionnaire

The following pages contain an edited version of the questionnaire for the SHS, derived from the computerised script for the survey. The starting point for the document is the script that was used in 2006. Substantial changes were made for the start of the new contract in 2007 and deletions and additions for 2007 are noted.

The script that was launched in February 2007 was found to be too long when interviewing started – the average interview was taking 60 minutes instead of the anticipated 45 minutes. The longer script was used for the first five months of the survey but in June 2007 substantial cuts were made, mainly involving cutting the proportion of the sample being asked questions. These changes are noted in the table below.

Minor amendments were made for the start of fieldwork each year between 2008 and 2011 and these are also noted in the script.

Question changes 2011

Due to the high level of demand for space in the SHS, the questionnaire undergoes a substantial review every two years and a light refresh in the years in between to ensure that the information collected is relevant to current policy interests and is making the best use of the time in the survey. The existing questionnaire was updated prior to the start of 2011 and a number of sections were revised. The key changes made were:

- HA3 (household relationship matrix) new response options added
- RE10C (bus services) items D, E and F deleted and item M added
- RE10E (train services) items D, E and F deleted and item M added
- HH57 and HH59 (benefits) item T added
- HB2 (property type) old question reinstated
- HB3 (lowest floor level) old question reinstated
- HB4 ('other' property type) old question reinstated
- RAND_ID (sexual identity) question added
- RECYC (recycling) item F deleted
- AREA4 (greenspace in area) question deleted
- AREA5 (greenspace used) question deleted
- GREEN1 (distance to greenspace) question added
- GREEN2 (greenspace used) question added

Question numbers in the script and variable names in the data

In most cases the question name used in the script matches the relevant variable in the data. However, where there are multiple parts to a question or the question is asked about a number of people, the variable name is extended by the use of alphabetical or numerical suffixes. Numerical suffixes indicate that the variable relates to one of a number of units of analysis – people etc. For example, HA5 asks for the age of each household member so the relevant variable names are HA5_1 through to HA5_10, with the extension indicating the household member the variable relates to (persons 1 to 10).

Where the extra variables relate to a question where a multiple response is allowed, letters rather than numbers are used in the variable names. For example variables relating to RB3 (neighbourhood dislikes) are called RB3A to RB3R, with each one relating to a different possible dislike about the neighbourhood. In a few cases, the way in which the variables are named is not consistent with these general conventions – for example, where new questions are added but the names of existing variables (or previously used names) are such that they prevent the new ones being named in accordance with the convention. Increasingly, questions are being given names that try to convey the topic rather than describing where they sit in the script. These do not always translate directly to SPSS variable names so the question shows both the question name and the variable name used in the data.

One section of the questionnaire – the ‘travel diary’, which deals with respondents’ travel patterns in the previous 24 hours - is almost entirely excluded from this questionnaire. The travel diary is a very complicated set of questions containing multiple ‘loops’ and complex routing, which is difficult to reproduce on paper in a form that would be easily comprehensible. For this reason, only the section of the diary relating to one single stage journey is included here. There are also questions catering for multi-stage journeys and journeys which involve a series of calls. A full set of the questions in the travel diary is available from the SHS Project Manager on request.

The routing given in this script is a simplified version of the very complex computer-assisted personal interviewing (CAPI) programme used for the survey. For example, there are many places where the CAPI script checks the credibility of an answer to a question, produces an error message if the interviewer has made an invalid entry or combination of entries, and requires that the error be dealt with before proceeding. The script also produces warning messages in some cases where a response appears very improbable (e.g. if the interviewer has recorded that a household has more than five cars), in which case the interviewer can either confirm the entry or go back and key in the correct value. Within each topic, filters (e.g. "if person has heard of it") apply to all subsequent questions, unless the appearance of another filter (e.g. "if person has used it") indicates otherwise.

In multi-code questions, an asterisk (*) indicates an exclusive code i.e. an option that cannot be selected in combination with any other code. For example, None, Refused, Don't know would generally be exclusive options.

In many cases the variable naming does not follow the order in the questionnaire or there are a large number of variables related to a question. In these cases, the response options have been given alphabetical labels – A, B, C etc – to indicate how they relate to the variables in the SPSS data.

Text in braces {} is optional text substituted by the CAPI system to vary the wording of the question depending on the circumstances of the respondent. For example, question AREA3 varies for people living alone and those living with other people. For someone living alone, the question is “Where

does your nearest family member live?” and for those living with other people the question is “Apart from the people you live with, where does your nearest family member live?”. The question is shown a {Apart from the people you live with} where does your nearest family member live?”

HH – HOUSEHOLD INCOME

The routing in the income section is particularly complex. Income information is gathered about the Highest Income Householder, his or her spouse or partner and the Random Adult. The routing will depend on who is being interviewed (HIH or partner).

Approximately 30% of all households have some missing data in the household income section either because they refuse to provide the information or they do not know some or all of the information. The information collected from these questions is used to impute values that are missing. Because of the high level of missing information in the raw data, only the final cleaned and imputed data is included in public datasets.
